To ensure equal access for all children to additional experiences.

To promote healthy lifestyles, support concentration levels and develop leadership.

Plant, grow, cook, eat agenda implemented across the school.

To ensure all children have access to locally sourced produce and access wider range of tastes and experiences.

To continue to foster a sense of belonging within the school.
